Questions for Reflection and Discussion

I.	Do you believe that Jesus Christ rose from the dead physically? If not, why not? If so, why is His resurrection important to you?
2.	Read Ephesians 1:18-20 and Ephesians 3:20-21, focusing on the word "power". What do these verses teach about God's power and its availability to us? In what aspect of your life do you most long to experience God's power?
3.	Read 2 Peter I:3. If you are a Christian, in what areas of your life has God's power made you a better person? In what areas have you changed less than you hoped you would? If you are not yet a Christian, do you think you can become the person you want to be without God's power? Why or why not?
4.	Read Acts I:8 and Romans I:16. If God gives us the power to share a message that has the power to save others, why do you think that power is not always evident? What are some signs that His power is at work when we share the gospel?
5.	Read Colossians 1:11. What are some of the promises of God that you are still waiting to see fulfilled? How has His power been at work in your life while you wait?
